Hon. Kiiru Gachomba: Thank you Mr. Speaker, members have the report in their files and I want to take you through. We shall start with the introduction.

Examination of the Supplementary Budget Estimates for FY2015/2016

Mr. Speaker Sir, pursuant to Section 135 (1) and (2) of the Public Finance Management Act 2012 the County Treasury prepared and submitted the County 1st Supplementary Budget Estimates FY2015/2016 to the County Assembly.

Upon receipt of the 1st Supplementary budget estimates FY2015/2016 by the Office of the Clerk the same was tabled in the House on 22nd December, 2015 and through a resolution of the House, it was committed to the Budget and Appropriations Committee for scrutiny.

The Committee scrutinized the 1st Supplementary budget estimates FY2015/2016 for the County Executive and the County Assembly and compiled its report.

The report was moved and adopted by the House with amendments on Thursday the 31st December, 2015 in a special sitting; the amendments made were endorsed as resolutions of the House pursuant to Article 202 of the County Assembly Standing Orders.

Submission of the Resolutions to the County Treasury

Mr. Speaker Sir, from the foregoing the resolutions as approved by the County Assembly were submitted to the County Treasury on 5th January 2016, which was to be the base for preparation of the County Supplementary Appropriation Bill 2016.

Submission of the County Supplementary Appropriation Bill 2016

Mr. Speaker Sir in accordance with Section 129 (7) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 the County Treasury prepared the County Supplementary Appropriation Bill 2016.

On 25th January, 2015 the County Supplementary Appropriation Bill 2016 was submitted to the Office of the Clerk through a letter Ref: NYA/CNT.GOV/CT/F&P/BUDGET/3/1/19 dated 25th January 2016.

Examination of the County Supplementary Appropriation Bill 2016

Mr. Speaker Sir upon receipt of the County Supplementary Appropriation Bill 2016 the same was tabled in the House on Thursday the 28th January, 2016 (Special sitting) and through a resolution of the House it was committed to the Budget and Appropriations Committee for scrutiny and compilation of a report.

The Committee scrutinized the County Supplementary Appropriation Bill 2016 in its sitting held at the TopCliff Lodge, Nakuru on 28th January 2016 and has made the following observations and recommendations.

Hon. James Gachomba: ... Mr. Speaker, I believe every member is aware of why we are here today. The business hand relates to the supplementary budget that will allow us to, before the end of this financial year, offer and implement various services and projects to our people including provision of bursaries, upgrading of roads, and improvement of agriculture among others.

With that Mr. Speaker, I wish to call upon Hon. Ann Kionero to second. Thank you.

Hon. Ann Kionero: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I wish to second the County Supplementary Appropriation Bill, 2016. Thank you Mr. Speaker.

Speaker: Considering that it was not necessary to second since the House gave the Committee on Budget and Appropriations a chance to give an overview of the report before the Bill is read for the second time I wish to open the floor for any member who would wish to comment on the report on the Supplementary Appropriation Bill.

Yes Hon. Samuel Thuita

Hon. Samuel Thuita: Thank you Mr. Speaker. We are aware there is money still in the County Revenue Account which should be used to undertake various activities within the county.

The Committee on Budget and Appropriations was mandated to confirm whether the approved figures if the supplementary estimates correspond with those in the Supplementary Appropriations Bill.

The mover has read this report word for word. In view of this, there was a general feeling that the document on the supplementary estimates had been tampered with but the Committee on Budget and Appropriations sat up to late hours of the night yesterday to make sure everything was right. In fact, the committee works passionately for the benefit of this county.

Considering that this House works tirelessly including convening for special sittings like today's to keep the Executive on toes, we should perform our oversight role to ensure that the money especially for development is utilised to the last coin. In relation to this, the Departments of Health Services and Public Works, which enhance health of our people and infrastructure respectively, consume a lot of money.

Committee of this House should ensure that the various departments of the Executive work. Some departments request for more money; but when you consider what they do with the money they have been allocated you wonder why they want more money.

Mr. Speaker, you remember that, in a forum, the MPs were questioning what we, the MCAs, have done with the little money that have been allocated at our disposal. We know the Executive is the one that should ensure proper utilisation of the money allocated to the county government. Accordingly, the Executive should utilise the money disbursed to the county government legitimately.

As we proceed to the Committee of Supply, I urge this House to approve the Supplementary Appropriation Bill.

Hon. James Gachomba: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I beg to move the following motion:

That the Nyandarua County Supplementary Appropriation Bill, 2016 be now read a second time

Mr. Speaker, bearing in mind that we have been recalled from recess in order to approve the Supplementary Appropriation Bill, I wish to caution the Executive that time for sleep is over. Remember we have a very short time before this financial year comes to a close. Considering that about one billion shillings have been allocated for maintenance of roads, I urge the department of Roads, Public Works and Transport to hasten the preparation of BQs for the same. I understand that some of our motor graders and shovels have been grounded; but they should be repaired with the Kshs. 7 million that has been allocated for the same. 52

This House cannot continue appropriating money for the departments that do not perform; a good example is the Department of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries which has messed this county. This department imported rotten seeds, procured fertiliser and rams that were not of much help to our farmers.

Finally, I petition the county assembly management to ensure completion of the new assembly chambers so that by next month the assembly can relocate to it.

Having said that I call upon Hon. Samuel Thuita to second.

Speaker: Yes Hon. Samuel Thuita

Hon. Samuel Thuita: Mr Speaker, I rise to second the motion on the second reading of the Supplementary Appropriation Bill.

I believe every other member of this House shares the sentiments of the mover. I also agree that the new county assembly chambers should be completed the soonest considering that millions of money have been allocated to facilitate the same. I do not understand why completion of the chambers is taking too long. I think the reason why resolutions of this House are not taken seriously is because the implementers consider the premises from which we conduct our affairs and fail to take us seriously. I believe when we relocate to the new

chambers, bearing in mind it is a ultra-modern one, implementers will be taking our resolutions seriously.

Having said that I beg to second. Thank you.

Hon. James Gachomba: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I thank all members of this House for committing themselves to ensure passing of this Supplementary Appropriation Budget.

I therefore urge the Executive to ensure that every coin of the appropriated money is put to the rightful use. Due to the perception that this House has no teeth to bite, various departments of the Executive have not been submitting the performance reports which this House has been asking for. That notwithstanding, I urge our county assembly management to ensure that resolutions of this House are taken seriously by the relevant authorities.
