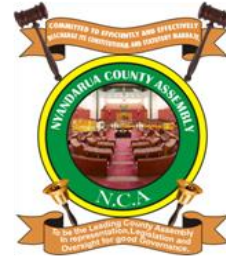

CONTROL BOARD**

**Honourable Members,**

You recall that sometime before the House proceeded for recess and in particular during the sitting of 30<sup>th</sup> April 2015, there was tabled in the House a list of nominees to the Nyandarua County Alcoholic Drinks Control Board for approval, as required by the Nyandarua County Alcoholic Drinks Control Act, 2014.

The House being on recess, the Leader of Majority Party in accordance with Article 29(1) and (2) of the Standing Orders, requested the Speaker by a letter dated the 8<sup>th</sup> day of

May, 2015 to convene a special sitting today the 11<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2015 at 11.00 a. m for the House to consider the report by the Committee on Education, Sports, Culture, Labour and Social Services on the vetting of the nominees for suitability of office to the Nyandarua County Alcoholic Drinks Control Board.

The matters of Assembly's approval or disapproval of candidates are strictly governed by the Public Appointment (Parliamentary Approval) Act. The Act provides for timelines within which such exercise is to be undertaken and with obvious consequences in event that it not undertaken within the prescribed time. Unless this House considers the matter within the prescribed time in accordance with Act, the nominees shall be deemed as having been approved.

The above being the case and considering that the House is on recess, and in order to accord the House an opportunity to consider the matter, the Chair was satisfied that the business proposed for the special sitting is urgent or exceptional and therefore convened this special sitting. Thereafter, the House shall stand adjourned until the day appointed for resumption in our adopted calendar.
