- iii. **Hon. Micheal Kirumba** (MCA, Kipipiri Ward) gave notice of the following motion:-

AWARE that the County Enforcement Officers are instrumental to enforcing peace and order; overseeing the enforcement of county laws; enforcing effective revenue collection; assisting the building inspectorate in enforcing compliance with approved building and construction by-laws and carrying out any other duties as assigned by their supervisors.

This House urges the County Public Service Board to ensure that all successfully recruited candidates for the positions of County Enforcement Officers are issued with their letters of appointment.

8. Bills: the following bills were read for the first time.

Speaker directed that the House Business Committee would allocate time for the same after 30 days.**

- i. **Hon.Edinald King'ori** the Vice-chairman, House Business Committee moved the following **procedural motion**

The Leader of Majority moved an amendment on the last page last column by deleting the number 6 and replacing it with 7. The amendment was seconded by Hon. Daniel Kibebo.
