2. Communication from the Chair

The Chair made the following communication;

“Hon Members, although I have not been able to look comprehensively at what happened this morning in the house pertaining to the matters of the Committee on Budget, I would want to put my case very clearly. And I have always said that we are not doing these things for ourselves. We are doing it for our faith in the law and for the purposes of how we are going to be judged by history and for the future. I looked at that particular motion. Actually it is not compliant with the law. It clearly flies in the face of the law. I am not overruling it because it has to be overruled by

a motion. But as the Speaker of this house, I am going to write a very comprehensive communication on that particular motion. Also Members, there has been issues that have been raised on the floor of this house and captured by the house which are very erroneous and are not correct and they do not reflect the facts of the budget that you are supposed to approve in this house.

Those issues some of them like the Ward Development Fund was actually increased to 300 million, the roads was increased to 10 million, water was given five point something million. So, those things are very clear. And when we move a motion here of for the purposes of moving certain directions and which are not correct. It is not fair and we are going to be judged very harshly by the people. Therefore I am going to deliver myself very clearly in a communication that will be delivered tomorrow but for as long as I am here because I communicated comprehensively about this issue yesterday. I will not overrule that motion. Whatever was passed in that motion will proceed vide the way people want to proceed but we shall have to make this house appreciate the true position of all these issues”.

BILLS

There were no bills introduced to the House.

MOTIONS

- i. **Hon. Sylvester Kagiri Mwangi the chairperson Committee on Public Investments and Accounts** moved the motion that the House adopts the report of the Committee on Public Investments and Accounts on Audited Financial Operations on the Nyandarua County Executive in FY 2013/2014 as a report of the House and the recommendations as resolutions of the House.

The motion was seconded by Hon. Suleiman Kihika Kimani.

The Speaker proposed the Question.

At 5.00 pm, Hon. James Mwangi Gichuki raised a point of order that there is no Quorum in the House. The Speaker directed that the quorum bell be rang pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 35. Quorum was achieved at 5.07 pm.

At 5.12 p.m., Hon. Peter Wahome Kamoche sought leave to move a motion to adjourn the House pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 31. The speaker granted leave for moving of the motion on adjournment. The motion was seconded by Hon. John Kieru Wambui.

The Speaker declined to propose the Question and directed that the motion by Hon. Sylvester Kagiri Mwangi on Audited Financial Operations on the Nyandarua County Executive in FY 2013/2014 does continue. Hon. Michael Njoroge Kirumba rose to make his contribution to the motion.

Hon. James Mwangi Gichuki rose on a point of order that the Members be given time to go through the PIC/PAC report so that they can make their contributions on the report from an informed position. The Speaker directed the House that since the first motion for adjournment had been disallowed, then the viable option is for any Member to move another motion for adjournment.

At 5.32 p.m., Hon. John Kieru sought for adjournment pursuant to Article 31 of the standing on the grounds that the motion of which the House was seized was sensitive one and therefore the Members would like to be given time to go

through the report and make their contributions with the knowledge of the contents of the report. The motion of adjournment was allowed by the Speaker and seconded by Hon. Josphat Kamau.

The question on the motion was put by the Speaker and agreed to and the House adjourned.

The Speaker directed that the interrupted business be included in the order paper of the next day.
