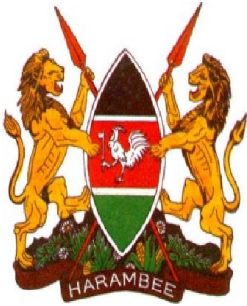


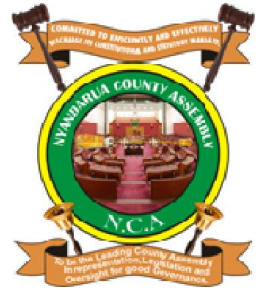

### MOTIONS

i. Hon. David Mwangi Ndirangu

Mr. Speaker Sir,

I beg to move the following motion:

That Aware that the provision of security services is a critical function of the government to its citizenry. Further aware that the constitution under article 189 of the Constitution encourages the cooperation between national and county governments in execution of their functions.

Concerned of the prevailing crime rate in the county and the lack of adequate security personnel and proper infrastructure in the county to arrest the situation.

Now therefore I urge this house do resolve that the Governor does establish the Nyandarua County Security Program and engagement with the National Government to alleviate the security of the county which among other issues will include the following initiatives:

1. Establishment of County Inspectorate for enforcement of county laws. Get trained personnel in security as well as establish partnerships with Kenya Police Training College and the National Youth Service.
2. Enter into an arrangement with the Judiciary for establishment of County Courts for just enforcement of County Laws.
3. Police presence and response through availability of vehicles – 50 fuelled and maintained security vehicles so that each of our 25 wards will have two police cars- (one for the police and the other for County Inspectorate), and our county will have enough police coverage with a projection to double the fleet in two years' time.
4. Security emergency numbers operational 24 hours - These will be manned using call centers for speedy security and emergency response.
5. Street lighting to enhance visibility – All towns and villages in Nyandarua to have lights installed.
6. Nyandarua Emergency and Security Patrol bases: setting up of emergency centres in towns with emergency bases with a security car, ambulance, fire engine and breakdown vehicle for speedy and effective security and emergency operations.
7. Police Dogs: To enable tracking of criminals, the county should invest in 50 police dogs to be used in all villages and towns to track criminals. Every ward will have a trained Police Dog.
8. Alcohol Blow: To supplement the great work being done by the National Government and to enforce the Alcoholic Drinks Control Act“ do not drink and drive law”, to partner with the National Transport and Security

Authority for police and enforcement officers in Nyandarua to have adequate alcohol blow devices and speed guns.

**That,**“The motion having been satisfactorily moved and adopted as a resolution of the House, I now direct that the resolutions set forth be communicated to the relevant authority, that is, the Office of the Governor for the necessary action.

In light of this and taking into consideration that police services are a function of the National government as in the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and appreciating the spirit of the Constitution and in particular Article 189 which provides for cooperation between the National government and County government. And,

In addition, the County Government Act in section 118 provides for shared services stating that,

“A county government may enter into an agreement with the national government, another county or an agency of the national government, to provide or receive any service that each county participating in the agreement is empowered to provide or receive within its own jurisdiction, including services incidental to the primary purpose of any of the participating counties”

Taking the foregoing into consideration, I further direct that the Office of H.E the Governor does within a reasonable time respond and communicate to the County Assembly on the modalities and measures(including consultation with the National government) on the implementation of the resolutions set forth and taking into account the financial implication to the County budget in the implementation of the programme”
